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FOREWORD

Our whānau are diverse, their needs are varied and their aspirations are plentiful. Te Pou Matakana seeks to provide support for whānau which acknowledges their diversity, delivers on their needs and ultimately, puts them on the pathway towards their aspirations. Kaiārahi are the key to achieving this and they are the backbone of Whānau Ora. Without Kaiārahi, commissioning for outcomes and implementing a shared outcomes framework for whānau across Te Ika a Māui could not be possible. Kaiārahi are responsible for translating the Whānau Ora policy and framework into practice. Practice, which goes beyond goal setting, assessments and service navigation, and towards real empowering practice. It is within this practice that the true value of Kaiārahi lies.

The purpose of this document is to highlight the work that Kaiārahi undertake and the outcomes they have supported whānau to achieve. That being said, the full scope of what Kaiārahi do on a day-to-day basis is difficult to quantify, and to more accurately describe their mahi requires us to look beyond what we traditionally perceive as work. Terms such as FTE, caseloads and contracts are often redundant in the world of Kaiārahi, who work outside of such structures to achieve the best outcomes for whānau. This is Whānau Ora best practice. Kaiārahi are the backbone of Whānau Ora.

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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Kaiārahi is a Whānau Ora navigator service that engages and supports whānau to develop a plan, set goals and achieve their intended outcomes. Across Te Ika a Māui (North Island), Te Pou Matakana (TPM) funded 209.2 Kaiārahi positions in the 2016/17 fiscal year. This report analyses data for each of the six TPM contracted regions across the North Island: Te Tai Tokerau, Tāmaki Makaurau, Hauraki-Waikato, Waiariki, Ikaroa-Rāwhiti, and Te Tai Hauāuru.

WHĀNAU SUPPORTED

In 2016/17 fiscal year, 5,420 whānau were engaged with the TPM Kaiārahi programme across all TPM Partners. Among these whānau, 4,618 (85%) developed a plan and set goals for themselves. These 4,618 whānau, included 11,068 whānau members, of which, more than half (55%) were under 25 years of age. The majority (55%) of whānau members were female, and more than eight out of ten (85%) whānau members identified themselves as Māori with a further 6% as Pacific.

OUTCOME DOMAINS

Across the contracted Partners almost one third (30%) of planned outcomes were linked to whānau standards of living; followed closely by whānau health (29%); 20% were linked with whānau knowledge; 10% were linked with whānau relationships; 9% were linked with whānau participation in the community; and only 2% of all planned outcomes linked with whānau engagement in Te Ao Māori.

Of the total of 10,878 planned whānau outcomes, 5,284 (49%) were achieved within this fiscal year. Overall the largest numbers of all outcomes achieved were in the whānau health domain (1,580 or 30%), the whānau standards of living domain (1,484 or 28%) and the whānau knowledge domain (1,058 or 20%).

OUTCOME AREAS

The ten most common outcome areas accounted for almost two-thirds (62%) of planned outcomes. Of these the most common outcome areas were physical health, education and/or training, and whānau and/or social health.

OUTCOMES

The 20 most common outcomes accounted for over half (57%) of all planned whānau outcomes. The top six whānau outcomes planned were increased knowledge or skills through education or training (6%); improved physical health (5%); improved income (5%); improved whānau or social health (4%); increased whānau employment (4%); and increased housing standards including completed household maintenance (4%).

This report, first summarises the outcomes planned by whānau across Te Ika a Māui, and then summarises the outcomes planned by whānau within each of the six TPM contracted regions.

WHĀNAU ACROSS TE IKA A MĀUI (NORTH ISLAND)

NUMBER OF WHĀNAU ENGAGED

Table 1 shows that 5,420 whānau were engaged with TPM contracted Whānau Ora Partners across the six TPM regions from 1st July 2016 to 30th June 2017.

NUMBER OF WHĀNAU WHO HAVE DEVELOPED A PLAN AND HAVE SET GOALS

Table 2 shows that of the 5,420 whānau engaged, 85% (or 4,618) were assessed, developed a plan with goals, and had identified their intended outcomes.

WHĀNAU MEMBER DEMOGRAPHICS FOR TE IKA A MĀUI

Table 4 below summarises the demographic information of individual whānau members. The majority of whānau members (55%) were Female. Over half (55%) of whānau members were under 25 years. Across Te Ika a Māui, 85% of whānau members identified themselves as Māori, and a further 6% as Pacific Islanders. Therefore, nine out of ten whānau members were of Māori or Pacific Island descent.

WHĀNAU OUTCOMES

This section describes planned whānau outcomes by TPM region; by TPM Outcome Domain; and by TPM Outcome Area within each TPM Outcome Domain. It also specifies the number of outcomes achieved in each region within the fiscal year. We should note that it is common for whānau to set goals where an outcome will be achieved in two or three years into the future.

Table 5 below summarises the outcomes planned and achieved within each region. There were over 10,800 whānau outcomes planned across the six TPM Regions. Te Tai Tokerau had the largest number of planned outcomes (20% of total outcomes), followed by whānau in Ikaroa-Rāwhiti (with 18% of total outcomes). Whānau in Hauraki-Waikato and Waiariki both shared a similar number of outcomes planned (17% each). Next, were whānau in Te Tai Hauāuru and in Tāmaki Makaurau respectively 16% and 12% of total outcomes were planned.

In total 5,284 whānau outcomes were achieved in the 2016/17 fiscal year. The largest numbers of outcomes achieved were in the Waiariki (1,119 or 21%), Hauraki-Waikato (1,062 or 20%), Te Tai Hauāuru (954 or 18%), and Te Tai Tokerau (947 or 18%) regions.

NUMBER OF WHĀNAU OUTCOMES PLANNED AND ACHIEVED, BY OUTCOME DOMAIN

Table 6 below shows the number of whānau outcomes planned and achieved by TPM Outcome Domain. It indicates that 30% of the outcomes planned were linked to whānau standards of living and 29% were linked to whānau health. Whānau knowledge, and whānau relationships covered 20% and 10% of the outcomes planned, respectively. The least common outcome domain linked to whānau outcomes planned was engagement in Te Ao Māori (2%). More than three-quarters (78%) of whānau outcomes achieved were associated with whānau health, whānau standards of living and whānau knowledge.

NUMBER OF WHĀNAU OUTCOMES PLANNED BY OUTCOME AREA WITHIN EACH **OUTCOME DOMAIN**

Table 7 below breaks down the TPM outcome domains into constituent outcome areas for Te Ika a Māui (North Island). It shows that housing standards was the most common outcome area within the standards of living domain (covering 29% of their planned outcome within this domain). Physical activity constituted 36% of whānau health outcomes. Education or training was the most common outcome area within the whānau knowledge domain (51%). Wider whānau relationships constituted 31% of outcomes within whānau relationships domain. Connection to community networks covered 47% of outcomes within the whānau participation in the community domain.

WHĀNAU BY REGION

WHĀNAU MEMBER DEMOGRAPHICS BY TPM REGION

GENDER

Table 10 shows that just over half of all whānau members (55%) supported by the Kaiārahi programme were female across all regions. Hauraki-Waikato and Tāmaki Makaurau had the highest (58%) and lowest (52%) population of females respectively.

AGE

Across all the TPM regions, more than four out of ten (44%) of all whānau members supported were children under 18 years of age. Only 4% of all whānau members in all the regions were aged 65 years and above. Ikaroa-Rāwhiti has the largest cohort of whānau members aged between 25-44 years (28%).

ETHNICITY

Across all the regions, whānau members were most likely to identify as Māori (85%), followed by Pacific (6%), European/Pākehā (5%), and Other (3%). Waiariki and Tāmaki Makaurau had the highest and lowest percentage of Māori whānau members at 90% and 69% respectively. Tāmaki Makaurau had the highest Pacific whānau members supported by the programme (14%), across the regions.

REGIONAL ANALYSIS

TE TAI TOKERAU

Whānau outcomes by TPM outcome domain

The table below shows the number of whānau outcomes planned and achieved by TPM outcome domain within the Te Tai Tokerau region. There were over 2,200 outcomes planned in Te Tai Tokerau. In this region, around two-thirds of planned outcomes were associated with whānau standards of living (32%) and whānau health (31%). Whānau knowledge and whānau relationships covered another third of the outcomes planned for all the members in Te Tai Tokerau.

In Te Tai Tokerau, 947 outcomes were achieved in the 2016/17 fiscal year. Approximately two-thirds (65%) of all outcomes achieved were associated with whānau health (309 or 33%) and whānau standards of living (307 or 32%).

Whānau outcomes

Whānau outcomes

The table below shows the top 20 whānau outcomes planned within the Te Tai Hauāuru region. These top 20 outcomes accounted for 55% of whānau outcomes planned for this region. Of all these outcomes, the top seven outcomes that covered almost one-third (30%) of all the outcomes planned for whānau within this region were: improved physical health; improved whānau or social health; increased knowledge or skills acquired through education or training; improved income; increased financial provisions for the future or savings or investments; improved confidence or attitude regarding connecting to community networks; and improved whānau or household relationships.

SUMMARY

The Te Pou Matakana Kaiārahi Programme engaged 5,420 whānau in 2016/17 fiscal year across Te Ika a Māui (North Island). There are six TPM contracted regions across the North Island: Te Tai Tokerau, Tāmaki Makaurau, Hauraki-Waikato, Waiariki, Ikaroa-Rāwhiti, and Te Tai Hauāuru.

Across all these regions, whānau members were most likely to identify as Māori (85%), followed by Pacific (6%), European/Pākehā (5%), and Other (3%). Among all whānau members, 85% had developed a plan and set goals for themselves. The most commonly planned whānau outcomes across all regions were associated with improving whānau standards of living, whānau health and whānau knowledge. For example, whānau in five out of six regions highly prioritised increased physical health and knowledge through further education and/or training, whānau in four out of six regions highly prioritised housing standards, improved incomes and financial management, and increasing their saving or investments.

Overall a total of 5,284 whānau outcomes were achieved across the six regions in the 2016/17 fiscal year. The largest number of whānau outcomes achieved were associated with whānau health (30%), whānau standards of living (28%), and whānau knowledge (20%).



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
